Rational: After gathering feedback from students, parents and teachers this Google Classroom timetable has been designed. It aims to address concerns around: consistency across all subjects, clarity of instruction and expectations, COVID19 flexibility due to differing family circumstances and 'shrinking the mountain' for students to improve engagement.

How it works:

1. This timetable simply shows you when work will be **'set'** each week
2. All work set will have a **'1 week'** deadline
3. We **'recommend'** students complete the work when it is set to give structure to their days. However we recognise this isn't always possible for a variety of reasons.
4. Some subjects might set work that requires **more than** the allotted morning / afternoon session, this is where the 1 week deadline comes in, allowing sufficient time to complete the tasks.
5. After a week the work will move to an **'archive'** folder. These tasks can still be accessed but means the students 'to do' list doesn't become unmanageable
6. **Y10s** are expected to spend more time on each subject area as they have less subjects setting work
